**Humphrey**  
Bobby Humphrey was a running back at the University of Alabama from 1985 to 1988. During his sophomore year, he rushed for 1,471 yards and 15 touchdowns. In 1987, he rushed for 1,255 and finished 10th in the Heisman balloting and was named UPI's offensive player of the year. All total at Alabama, Humphrey rushed for 3,420 yards (a school record at the time), caught 60 passes for 523 yards, and scored 40 touchdowns. Humphrey played two seasons with the Denver Broncos where he was a 1990 Pro Bowl selection. He then played two years with the Miami Dolphins. Humphrey was the head coach of the Birmingham Steeldogs of the Arena Football League from 2000 to 2005. Since 2012, Humphrey has served as a vice-president for business development at Bryant Bank in Birmingham. Humphrey also serves as a member of the Hoover Parks and Recreation Board.

**Todd**  
Chris Todd was the starting quarterback for the Auburn Tigers for part of the 2008 season and all of the 2009 season. Under the tutelage of Gus Malzahn in 2009, Todd led the Tigers to 8 wins and a win in the Outback Bowl. Todd set an all-time Auburn school record for most touchdown passes in a season. He also tied the Auburn single-game record with 5 touchdown passes in a single game. Todd played high school football at Elizabethtown High School in Kentucky where he led his team to its first state title in 24 years. He started his collegiate career at Texas Tech before transferring to Hutchinson Community College and then Auburn. Todd now resides in Birmingham where he is a financial advisor with Merrill Lynch.



**HOUSTON NUTT**

Houston Nutt served as head football coach at Ole Miss, Arkansas, Boise State, and Murray State. He was head coach at Murray State from 1993 to 1996 where he won two Ohio Valley Conference Championships. His last two teams went a combined 16-0 in the OVC. He then went to Boise State for one year before becoming head coach at Arkansas where he served from 1998 to 2007. There he led the Razorbacks to 8 bowl games and 3 SEC Western Division championships. His best season was in 2006 when Arkansas went 10-4 with a 7-1 SEC record. He then went to Ole Miss for four seasons where he won two Cotton Bowls. Prior to becoming a head coach, Nutt served as an assistant under Jimmy Johnson at Oklahoma State and under Lou Holtz at Arkansas. Nutt now serves as a college football studio analyst for CBS Sports.



**TOMMY BOWDEN**

**Annual Awards Banquet**

Tommy Bowden served as head football coach of the Clemson Tigers from 1999 through 2008. During his time at Clemson, he led the Tigers to 8 bowl games. Prior to going to Clemson, Coach Bowden was the head coach at Tulane for two seasons. His 1998 team went 12-0 and finished in the top ten. Overall, Coach Bowden has a record of 90-49 as a head coach. Coach Bowden served through the years as an assistant at Florida State, Duke, Alabama, and Kentucky. He was Auburn's offensive coordinator from 1991-1996. Coach Bowden attended and played football at the University of West Virginia.

Coach Bowden resides in Santa Rosa Beach, Florida and spends a great deal of his time speaking at churches, men's conferences and Fellowship of Christian Athletes events. Coach Bowden is the son of legendary former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden. His brother, Terry, is the head coach at the University of Akron and is the former head coach of the Auburn Tigers.

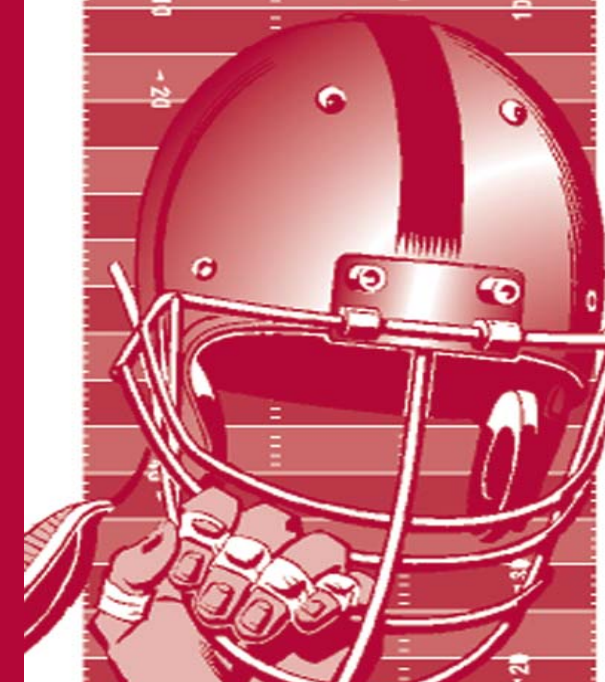

Gold started his sports broadcasting career in 1972 working as a weekend reporter for the Mutual Broadcasting System. He has done play-by-play assignments for professional hockey and he was the first play-by-play announcer for the UAB Blazers basketball team where he was a part of the broadcast team for 6 years. He was the voice of the Birmingham Barons baseball team for 4 seasons and was named the Southern League's Broadcaster of the year for 1983. Since 1976, he has been a member of NASCAR's

Overall, Pearl has led his teams to post-season play in 18 of his 21 years as a head coach. He previously served as an assistant at Stanford and at Iowa under Coach Tom Davis. A native of Boston, Pearl is a graduate of Boston College. Pearl's son, Steven, serves as an assistant coach at Auburn and played under his father at Tennessee.

**NEAL BROWN**

Neal Brown was named Troy University's 21st head football coach on December 1, 2014. Brown, at age 35, is the second youngest head coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision. Brown spent the previous two seasons as offensive coordinator at the University of Kentucky. Brown led the Wildcats to new heights on the offensive side of the football. Prior to going to Kentucky, Brown spent three seasons as offensive coordinator at Texas Tech under Tommy Tuberville. Brown previously spent four seasons at Troy (2006-2009), including the final two as the Trojans' offensive coordinator. Troy won four Sun Belt Conference titles and appeared in three bowl games during Brown's initial tenure. He played two years at the University of Kentucky and then two years at the University of Massachusetts.

Charlie Boren is in his third season as head football coach of the Faulkner University Eagles. During his two seasons as head coach he has compiled a 16-6 record. Boren was elevated to the head coach position after spending the previous two seasons as the assistant head coach and running backs coach. Boren came to Faulkner from Newton County High School in Mississippi. He previously served as head coach at Midfield, Montevallo, Bibb County, and St. Clair County. He has 113 wins as a high school head coach. Boren is a graduate of Jacksonville State University with a bachelor's degree. He has a Master's degree from UAB and an Education Specialist degree from the University of Montevallo. Boren's son, Blake, serves as his offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Brian Jenkins is in his second season as head football coach of the Alabama State Hornets. In his first season at ASU, the Hornets went 6-5 overall and finished second in the SWAC's East Division with a 5-4 record. The Hornets had wins the Magic City Classic and the Turkey Day Classic. Previously, Jenkins was head coach at Bethune-Cookman where he posted a 46-14 record. The Wildcats won or tied for four Mid-Eastern Atlantic Conference (MEAC) titles and won two HBCU national titles. Prior to going to Bethune, Jenkins coached 16 years as an assistant at Western Kentucky, Bowling Green, Eastern Illinois, Louisiana - Lafayette, and Rutgers. Jenkins played college football as a wide receiver and running back at the University of Cincinnati. He graduated in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in social work.

Mike Turk became Huntingdon's head football coach in May 2004 and added the title of Athletic Director in March 2013. Arriving on the heels of Huntingdon's winless first season, Turk has turned the Hawks into consistent winners. He has a record of 80-38 at Huntingdon. In 2015, the Hawks won their first conference championship and had their



**JIM DONNAN**

Jim Donnan served as head football coach at the University of Georgia from 1996 to 2000. He compiled a 40-19 while in Athens including a 25-15 SEC record. His best season was in 1997 when the Bulldogs went 10-2 and finished ranked #10. Prior to going to Georgia, Donnan was the head coach at Marshall from 1990 to 1995. The Thundering Herd went 64-21 during his tenure, including five consecutive 11-plus wins, four championship games, and the 1992 NCAA Division 1-AA National Championship. Donnan previously served as Offensive Coordinator at Oklahoma under Barry Switzer. Donnan played quarterback at North Carolina State where he was selected ACC Player of the Year in 1967. Donnan currently serves as a college football analyst. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2009.



**KAYLEE HARTUNG**

Kaylee Hartung is an award winning college sports reporter for ESPN. She regularly appears on SportsCenter and contributes to ESPN's coverage of college football, basketball and baseball as an in-game reporter. She is currently the sideline reporter for the SEC Network's Primetime Football game with legendary broadcaster Brent Musburger. Hartung joined ESPN in the fall of 2012 as an anchor and reporter for the Longhorn Network. She began her sports broadcasting career with the CBS Sports Network. Hartung spent five years in the Washington Bureau of CBS News where she was an associate producer for "Face the Nation" and served as an assistant to the venerable newsman Bob Schieffer. Hartung is a native of Baton Rouge, Louisiana and a graduate of Washington and Lee University where she majored in broadcast journalism.



**JAY JACOBS**

Jay Jacobs has served as Auburn University's Director of Athletics since December 22, 2004. Jacobs was named to the position after working in almost every area of the Auburn Athletics Department for the previous 20 years. Jacobs was an Auburn football team walk-on and went on to earn two letters as an offensive tackle in 1982 and 1983. Jacobs became Auburn's Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach in 1985. After serving two seasons as a graduate assistant football coach, Jacobs was named Conditioning Coach, a position he held from 1988-1991. In 1991, he became an Assistant Athletics Director. Three years later, he was promoted to Associate Athletics Director of Operations, overseeing a variety of support functions in the Athletics Department. Jacobs then served as Senior Associate Athletics Director in charge of Tigers Unlimited from 2001-2005.
